How to Participate

Working individually or in a team, students must create a project that represents sustainability or conservation in one of the following categories:

Environmental Conservation Plant Science

Virtual Submission Information:

Students are responsible for providing a visual representation of their project to submit virtually (video or photo).

Video Submission Requirements:

- Projects must be submitted via Flipgrid, a free app that is accessible from any device. You will receive instructions for using Flipgrid after your registration is complete.
- Video must be 5-10 minutes in length.
- Video must include a description of the creation process of the project and visuals of the project itself.
- Students must also answer a set of questions about their project for the judges.

Photo Submission Requirements:

- Submission can include up to 10 photos of the project from various angles.
- Photos must be accompanied by a written description of the creation process of the project.
- Students must also answer a set of questions about their project for the judges.

Projects and answers to the questions will be due by 5:00 p.m. on February 26, 2023.

How to Register

Registration is open now!

To register to participate, each student (or an adult representing the student) must submit the following information via email to education@hsvbg.org:

- Student name
- Student age and grade
- Parent/guardian or teacher name
- Name of school or homeschool organization
- Contact email and phone number
- A description of the project (250 words max) that includes the project category and how the project represents sustainability or conservation

Once your registration is processed, you will receive a list of questions and submission instructions via email.



Judging and Prizes

Projects will be separated by category and grade level. There are two grade level groups: K-5 and 6-12.

Judges will score the virtual submissions separate from in-person projects.

Judges will evaluate projects based on the following criteria:

- Project Purpose
- Design and Methodology
- Execution: Data Collection, Analysis and Interpretation
- Creativity
- Presentation

Cash prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in each category and grade level group separately for virtual and in-person projects. Winners will also receive a certificate and a souvenir item.

All winners will be announced on March 5th. Virtual participants will be required to pick up their certificates at the Garden.

Prize checks will be mailed at a later date.
